Below are several ways that Clark County Public Schools families can reduce the cost of purchasing internet for their homes. Not every family will qualify for every plan. Plans are subject to change.

Popular options

1. Emergency Broadband Benefit - FCC program that provides a discount of up to \$50/month for eligible households - info here: <https://www.fcc.gov/broadbandbenefit> and [here](#)
2. AT&T's Access - Internet service for \$10/month or less for eligible households (flier includes info about Emergency Broadband Benefit)

1. Many cellphone companies will allow you to turn your smartphone into a hotspot ("tethering"). There would most likely be an added fee on your monthly bill for this service
