I am so proud of our teachers, teacher assistants, food services department, family resource center coordinators, transportation department, maintenance department, central office staff, and administrative staff. With less than 36 hour notice, this group of folks put together a plan to get educational materials in the hands of all pre-school through twelfth grade students. Our food services workers alongside our transportation department put together a plan to deliver over 6,500 meals including two meals a day for all students in need during the first week of our school closure from March 16 through March 20.

Our maintenance and custodial staffs have cleaned and sanitized every building and bus in our district. Our central office staff, building administrators, school office staffs, and nurses have kept buildings open daily to communicate with our students, parents, and community.

I am proud and blessed that I get to see this demonstration of caring and dedication not only in difficult times but every day as this team of individuals makes life better for Clark County students and families. Clark County should be proud, as well.

We will continue to deliver food for our students at all current sites again this week of March 23 through March 27. Please visit www.clarkschools.net for our current list of sites. Clark County schools were already scheduled to be closed for Spring Break the week of March 30 through April 3. For that week, I am asking that all employees rest, be safe and try to enjoy time with family as all buildings will be closed to the public and staff.

For the week of spring break, our community has stepped up to allow our staff to have the opportunity to step away from the schools. Through volunteers from multiple churches, civic organizations, and governmental agencies, the lunch program will continue for our students. Meals will be provided by these groups at all currently scheduled locations and times. To these volunteers, on behalf of myself, the Clark County Board of Education, and all Clark County school employees, we say Thank You. Thank you for caring for our students, staff, and community. As a school district staff, we will use this time to do personal health checks, rest, allow our food supply lines to restock ensuring that will be back stronger than ever. It is still our current plan to return to schools on Monday, April 20, 2020.
