We are looking forward to seeing more of our Jaguars back in the building soon! Please see our hybrid plan below on how we will provide instruction safely to your child(ren).

General Expectations

Students and staff will be expected to wear their masks throughout the day, except when eating. Temperature checks will be taken upon arrival and again at lunch time. Social-distancing will be practiced and expected in all areas. Sanitizing between groups of children will occur between all transitions, and hand sanitizer is located in hallways and will be used frequently throughout the day. Social distancing stickers are on the floor throughout the building to assist students on where to stand.

Arrival

All students will arrive by car/bus-upon entry to the building, they will have a temperature check, receive hand sanitizer, and be given their breakfast. They will report directly to their classrooms to their assigned seat.

Instruction

Our goal is to treat the A and B days as close to a regular instruction day as possible, while being safety minded at all times. Instruction will be given in all core areas when students are in attendance.

Students who attend under the hybrid model will be given work to complete on the days they will work from home. That work will be due back the following week.

Related Arts

Related Arts (RA) classes (PE, Art, Music, STEM, and Library) will be part of the daily schedule. Students will be given hand sanitizer before entering the RA classrooms and rooms will be sanitized between classes.

Restrooms

Restrooms will continue to be cleaned every hour during the school day by our custodians. .

Lunch/Meal Pick-up

Students will be eating lunch in the cafeteria daily with their grade level while being seated socially distanced. Seats and tables will be sanitized between groups.

Students on the Hybrid A plan will take home breakfast for Wednesday on Tuesday when they leave. Students on Hybrid B plan will take home Saturday meals when they leave on Friday.

Meal pick-up for students not in the building will continue from 11:30-1:00 daily in the pick-up area behind the school. Saturday meals will be given out in the pick-up line on Fridays.

Holding Room

A separate holding room for any children with temperatures greater than 100.4 or higher is in place. Parents will be notified immediately for pick-up.

Teacher PE

Teacher PE will continue to be provided for children daily. However at this time, the playgrounds will not be in use. Children will play in the front loop and in the back bus area. Students are required to wear their mask and stay socially distanced during this time.

Dismissal

Dismissal has been revamped, and a new traffic pattern established for parent pick-up so students can be safely socially distanced while waiting for parents. Bus riders will also be socially distanced while waiting for the bus to arrive.

Visitors/Volunteers/Parents in the Building

At this time, to limit the number of people in contact with our students, no visitors or volunteers will be permitted in the school. Parents will only be permitted if picking up a child early from school. Please remember that a valid ID is required to check-out your child.

Safety Videos

Justice teachers have recorded safety videos for our students to review before entering the building. Please subscribe to the Justice YouTube channel (Justice Elementary) to view these with your child.

Safety Drills

Required safety drills (fire, severe weather, lockdown, and earthquake) will be held within the first two weeks of the hybrid method. We will practice social distancing when completing all drills.

Daily Attendance/Participation

Daily attendance will be taken for students who are in the building on the Hybrid Plan. When Hybrid students are working from home, they (or parents) are expected to check-in with the teacher through email, Dojo, Google Classroom, etc. in order to receive attendance/participation for that day.

Students (or parents) who are on full-time distance learning are expected to check-in daily with the teacher via Dojo, email, Google Classroom, live meets, etc. in order to receive attendance/participation credit for that day of learning.

Packet Work/Online Assignments

Assignments sent home for Distance Learning days are expected to be completed and returned to school or submitted online when due. Not returning assignments will have a negative impact on midterms/report cards.

Non-Compliance for Wearing Masks

Students are expected to wear their mask the entire day at school, except when eating. However, if a student should refuse to comply, a reminder will be given by the teacher. If the student refuses, they will be sent to the Weather Room or front office until compliant, and parent contact will be made. A third reminder to wear the mask will result in following Clark County district protocol and removing the student to full Distance Learning.
