



Hybrid Learning Plan

What does hybrid A and B look like?

Students listed as hybrid A will attend school in person on Mondays and Tuesdays and will participate in our daily videos on Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday from home. Students listed as hybrid B will attend school in person on Thursdays and Fridays and will participate in our daily videos on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesdays.

What will my student do on the days they are not attending in person?

Your student will be sent an interactive video for you and your child to watch together. Please take time to watch that video with your child and complete the activity. Please take a photo or video of your child completing the activity so we are able to document their developmental progress.

What if I want to stay virtual?

If you are more comfortable with your student participating in our program through a 100% virtual format, we are happy to accommodate you and your student. We will continue to offer our daily video lessons and request that you continue to take photos and videos to document your child's progress. We will continue to hold individual and group online classes where your student has the opportunity to receive individualized instruction from their teacher and peer to peer interactions.

What is preschool staff doing on Wednesdays?

Wednesdays are critical to the success of our hybrid plan. Staff will be filming the daily video lessons on Wednesdays to ensure we have content available for both students participating in hybrid learning and for students participating in 100% distance learning. This will be the day teachers hold individual meetings with students continuing to participate in the strictly virtual format. In addition staff will schedule small group virtual meetings with virtual students to ensure the essential social and peer interactions.

What will my student's day look like when they attend school?

Students will attend for two days in a row, either Monday and Tuesday or Thursday and Friday. While at school they will have access to a fairly typical school day with time spent in centers, gross motor time, breakfast, and lunch. Students will participate in small group carpet time and smaller numbers in each center. Centers include art, science, math, literacy, dramatic play, block play, technology, and more. They will wear a mask throughout the day apart from meal times where they will sit socially distanced from each other (every other seat) in the cafeteria.



How will the car line work?

Children that are being dropped off will be using the two lanes by the baseball field. Each car will be instructed when to move up to the uploading spots. While waiting in the car lane, children can begin to unbuckle and put their backpack and mask on. All persons will remain in their car until a staff member takes the child's temperature. If the temperature is in the proper range, an adult can exit the vehicle to help their child out. A staff member will take their child by the hand to the classroom. When picking up your child, you will enter through the same car lane, display your pickup number, and your child will be brought to your car. You will exit your vehicle to secure your child in your car.



How will the bus pick-up/drop-off work?

Children that are using bus transportation must wear a mask for the duration of the bus ride. Upon the arrival at school, children will exit the bus and use proper spacing, with mask remaining on to enter the building. The first temperature check of the day will take place as they enter the building. There will be a sticker on the floor for children to stand on for social distancing. After temperature check, children will be taken to their classroom for hand washing while social distancing in the classroom. If a child has a fever they will be taken to the isolation room and the parent will be notified for immediate pick-up.



What will my child's mealtime look like?

Your child will have access to two nutritional meals per day for breakfast and lunch. Teachers may choose to eat in their classroom or eat in the lunchroom. Students will travel through the lunch line socially distanced and wearing a mask. If eating in the lunchroom teachers will sit with their students at an assigned table. Students will sit in every other seat staggered across the table to support the desire for social distancing. Students and teachers can remove their masks for meal times.



What if my child does not feel well or displays any symptoms?

Our healthy at school guidelines require students to remain at home or be sent home if they have a fever (greater than 100.4), shortness of breath/respiratory distress, loss of taste or smell, vomiting, diarrhea, chills/muscle pain/body aches, excessive cough. Please note that runny noses will be sent home at the school nurse's discretion.



How do you social distance at preschool?

Preschool is a balance between social interaction and social distancing, we will do our best to social distance as much as possible, but young children aged 3-5 require social interaction and may work in groups of two or be less than socially distanced with the staff to ensure safety.
