B. Home Games

a. Attendance

i. Who can attend?

FOOTBALL:

Football: Segment 1: Following the Tier System suggested by the National Federation of High Schools, these people will have access to the event:

Tier 1 (Essential): Athletes, coaches that are listed on the KHSAA database, officials, event staff (Members of the chain crew, Time Keeper, PA Announcer, Administrators), Medical personnel (Trainers, EMT's), Security as assigned by School Resource Officer.

Tier 2 (Preferred): Media (Up to three radio people, one pre-authorized photographer per team, one newspaper representative for each team). 20 Cheerleaders will be allowed to participate and 35 Pep Band members will be allowed to enter.

Tier 3 (Non-essential): 20% of seating capacity will be allowed which is 835.

Football: Segment 2: Following the Tier System suggested by the National Federation of High Schools, these people will have access to the event:

Tier 1 (Essential): Athletes, coaches that are listed on the KHSAA database, officials, event staff (Members of the chain crew, Time Keeper, PA Announcer, ticket takers,

Administrators), Medical personnel (Trainers, EMT's), Security as assigned by School Resource Officer.

Tier 2 (Preferred): Media (Up to three radio people, one pre-authorized photographer per team, one newspaper representative for each team), 25 Cheerleaders per participating team and 45 Pep Band members will be allowed to enter.

Tier 3 (Non-essential): 30% of seating capacity will be allowed which is 1,253.

Football: Segment 3: Following the Tier System suggested by the National Federation of High Schools, these people will have access to the event:

Tier 1 (Essential): Athletes, coaches that are listed on the KHSAA database, officials, event staff (Members of the chain crew, Time Keeper, PA Announcer, ticket takers, Administrators), Medical personnel (Trainers, EMT's), Security as assigned by School Resource Officer.

Tier 2 (Preferred): Media (Up to three radio people, one pre-authorized photographer per team, one newspaper representative for each team), 30 Cheerleaders per participating team and 55 Pep Band members will be allowed to enter.

Tier 3 (Non-essential): 40% of seating capacity will be allowed which is 1671.

GIRLS BASKETBALL:

Girls Basketball: Segment 1: Following the Tier System suggested by the National Federation of High Schools, these people will have access to the event:

Tier 1 (Essential): Athletes, coaches that are listed on the KHSAA database, officials, event staff (Score Keeper, Libero Tracker, Line Judges (2), PA Announcer, Administrators), Medical personnel (Trainers, EMT's), Security as assigned by School Resource Officer.

Tier 2 (Preferred): Media (Up to three radio people, one pre-authorized photographer per team, one newspaper representative for each team).

Tier 3 (Non-essential): 20% of seating capacity will be allowed which is 460.

Girls Basketball: Segment 2: Following the Tier System suggested by the National Federation of High Schools, these people will have access to the event:

Tier 1 (Essential): Athletes, coaches that are listed on the KHSAA database, officials, event staff (Score Keeper, Libero Tracker, Line Judges (2), PA Announcer, ticket takers,

Administrators), Medical personnel (Trainers, EMT's), Security as assigned by School Resource Officer.

Tier 2 (Preferred): Media (Up to three radio people, one pre-authorized photographer per team, one newspaper representative for each team.).

Tier 3 (Non-essential): 30% of seating capacity will be allowed which is 690.

Girls Basketball: Segment 3: Following the Tier System suggested by the National Federation of High Schools, these people will have access to the event:

Tier 1 (Essential): Athletes, coaches that are listed on the KHSAA database, officials, event staff (Score Keeper, Libero Tracker, Line Judges (2), PA Announcer, ticket takers, Administrators), Medical personnel (Trainers, EMT's), Security as assigned by School Resource Officer.

Tier 2 (Preferred): Media (Up to three radio people, one pre-authorized photographer per team, one newspaper representative for each team).

Tier 3 (Non-essential): 40% of seating capacity will be allowed which is 920.

BOYS BASKETBALL:

Boys Basketball: Segment 3: Following the Tier System suggested by the National Federation of High Schools, these people will have access to the event:

Tier 1 (Essential): Athletes, coaches that are listed on the KHSAA database, officials, event staff (Score Keeper, Libero Tracker, Line Judges (2), PA Announcer, ticket takers, Administrators), Medical personnel (Trainers, EMT's), Security as assigned by School Resource Officer.

Tier 2 (Preferred): Media (Up to three radio people, one pre-authorized photographer per team, one newspaper representative for each team).

Tier 3 (Non-essential): 40% of seating capacity will be allowed which is 920.

VOLLEYBALL:

Volleyball: Segment 3: Following the Tier System suggested by the National Federation of High Schools, these people will have access to the event:

Tier 1 (Essential): Athletes, coaches that are listed on the KHSAA database, officials, event staff (Score Keeper, Libero Tracker, Line Judges (2), PA Announcer, ticket takers, Administrators), Medical personnel (Trainers, EMT's), Security as assigned by School Resource Officer.

Tier 2 (Preferred): Media (Up to three radio people, one pre-authorized photographer per team, one newspaper representative for each team).

Tier 3 (Non-essential): 40% of seating capacity will be allowed which is 920.

We will NOT be honoring senior citizen cards, district employees, or coaching cards during any segment due to COVID-19 restrictions and the requirement to track attendance.

ii. Parking

Opposing teams will be instructed where to park prior to arrival. Game officials will also be instructed where to park. Game officials will be asked to symptom check prior to arrival at our facilities. Parking for all others will take place in the student parking lot.

iii. Capacity

All venues: Segment 1 will be 20% capacity; Segment 2 will be 30% capacity; Segment 3 will be 40% capacity.

iv. Bleacher seating

Home and away bleachers will be clearly marked to provide ample social distancing between groups/families. This will be done in conjunction with the Local Health Department and the Clark County Maintenance staff. There shall be no mingling amongst the groups.

v. Kids Unattended

There shall be no unsupervised children/Students under 18 years of age at any time during the contest.

vi. Rules For Attendees

1. Masks - Masks must be worn at all times for anyone not physically participating in the contest. This includes upon entry, while seated, and at all

times except for when actively eating or drinking(per updated regulations as of September 3).

2. Movement - There shall be no mingling of fans and no children playing on the grounds.

vii. No Tailgating Anywhere On Property

There will be no tailgating allowed on school grounds. No one will be allowed access to the facilities until 60 minutes prior to the start of the first contest.

b. Entry/Tickets

i. Entrances

1. Entrances will be set up as followed:

Participating teams arriving by bus, coaches, administration, medical staff, event workers, etc. will be given instructions prior to arrival on where to park. Once parked they will go through the temperature check/symptom check procedure and then be given access to facilities. The visiting team will have already gone through the temperature/symptom check at their school, so they will not have to do this step. The visiting team will be instructed to come ready for play, as there will not be locker rooms available at any point for any sport.

2. All spectators will use the following entrances:

Football: the main stadium entrance.

Girl's Basketball, Boy's Basketball, and Volleyball: Use the main Front entrance at Robert D. Campbell.

At each entrance, spectators will present their pre-purchased tickets and go through the temperature check/symptom check, as well as write their name and phone number on a supplied card. Temperature check, symptoms check, and contact information are required. If anyone refuses any of these, they will not be allowed into the event. There will be one cash gate for those fans that do not have access to online purchasing. There will be a limited number of cash tickets available depending on the number of online sales.

ii. Pre-sold Tickets/Tickets

Segment 1, 2, and 3: Football - Each RDC football player, cheerleader, and band (if they play) member will be given the opportunity to purchase four tickets. Each visiting team

football player and cheerleader will be given the opportunity to purchase two tickets. The remainder of available tickets will be on sale for students and community.

Segment 1, 2, and 3: Girls Basketball - Each RDC Girls Basketball player and Cheerleader will be given the opportunity to purchase four tickets. Each visiting team basketball player and cheerleader will be given the opportunity to purchase two tickets. The remainder of available tickets will be on sale for students and community.

Segment 3: Boys Basketball - Each RDC Boys Basketball player and Cheerleader will be given the opportunity to purchase four tickets. Each visiting team basketball player and Cheerleader will be given the opportunity to purchase two tickets. The remainder of available tickets will be on sale for students and community.

Segment 3: Volleyball - Each RDC volleyball player will be given the opportunity to purchase four tickets. Each visiting team volleyball player will be given the opportunity to purchase two tickets. The remainder of available tickets will be on sale for students and community.

Tickets for all events will be sold using the GoFan app/website. GoFan will be able to send access codes to us and/or parents that will give them a window of time to purchase tickets. Each participant's family will have the opportunity to purchase an allotment of tickets during this window of time before ticket sales go public. More information on this will be communicated to everyone in the coming days. We will also initially have one cash gate for those fans that do not have access to online purchasing. There will be a limited number of cash tickets available depending on the number of online sales.

iii. Inappropriate Spectator Behavior

RDC will be asking for advice and additional support from our local Sheriff's Office along with City Police. We are hopeful their presence will deter any unruly behavior. Also, school SROs have been instructed to be on site and remove any fan not abiding by our rules or exhibiting inappropriate behavior.

c. Concessions

Only pre-packaged food will be served from concession stands with limited workers. Plan will be in accordance with local health department guidelines.

d. Visiting Team Arrival Procedures

Opposing teams arriving to our campus will be sent instructions on where to park prior to their arrival. They will have already taken their temperatures and completed the symptoms checklist prior to leaving their campus. Visiting teams will be instructed to come ready for play, as there will not be locker rooms available at any point for any sport.

e. Incidence Rates

We will be using the Current Incidence Rate found at www.kycovid19.ky.gov to determine if we will travel to or receive teams from certain counties. If a county is in the “red” status two days prior to our scheduled event, we will cancel the event.

f. No pre/post game meals

Teams will not have the opportunity to provide pre or post game meals. Individual sports will make accommodations for those students that will not have the opportunity to eat prior to leaving for their event.

g. Cleaning/Sanitizing/Disinfecting

Each area will be thoroughly sanitized either at the conclusion of competition or the next morning. We will work with custodial staff to develop a working schedule. Areas will be monitored and cleaned throughout the game when needed.

h. Restrooms

1. Public restrooms will be available at stadium and cleaned/sanitized frequently and ONLY in the main lobby/foyer at Letcher Norton Gymnasium
2. Ensure custodial staff at all home events to help maintain restrooms and other sanitation needs
3. Utilize custodians to work home events; schedule them to avoid overtime

i. Water/Hydration

1. All athletes/coaches must bring their own water bottles.
2. Water bottles must not be shared.
3. Food should not be shared.
4. Hydration stations (water cows, water trough, water fountains, etc.) must not be utilized.

j. Scheduling: 6th, 7th, and 8th grade

Schedules for each of the fall sports have been created. In doing so, we have taken the following steps to ensure COVID-19 protocols are met:

1. ALL Non-conference games have been cancelled
2. Both Girls Basketball and football have reduced the number of total games. (Ex.Football only has 5 games (3 home and 2 Away)).

k. Press Box

1. 2 coaches per team in press box
2. 1 film person per team on top of press box
3. Spotter
4. Scoreboard
5. Announcer
6. 2 play-by-play for each team
7. 2 Video board/Sound system operators
8. Seating charts will be created and maintained

l. Emergency Storm Protocols

We will follow our school Emergency Action Plan for athletic contests in the event of an emergency.

m. Isolation areas and sickness protocols

1. If a student, coach, or official is, or becomes, sick on site with symptoms of COVID-19, they shall be placed in an identified and designated quarantine/isolation area with a mask in place until they can be picked up.
2. Staff who are identified to care for students must wear a mask.
3. If an ambulance is called, there shall be an attempt to call the hospital first to alert them that the person may have COVID-19.
4. If a student, coach, or official becomes sick, they must not use group transportation to return home.

n. Location Cheer (NO BAND)

1. Cheerleaders from both teams will be assigned a space on the home stadium sideline near the end zone and will follow social distancing guidelines

o. Letcher Norton Gymnasium Seating

1. Bleacher seating will allow for social distance guidelines.
2. Reserve Cardinal's Nest Red Bleachers for cheerleaders/parents not participating and Assign active cheerleaders spots behind the baskets.

C. Away Games

Coaches will check temperature of every person prior to loading the bus.

Coaches will perform symptoms checklist on every person prior to loading the bus.

Teams will load the bus ready for play and will not use home team locker rooms.

a. Transportation

Seating capacity limits will be adhered to that follow the guidelines of KDE and local health departments. Total number allowed on bus will be determined soon. Anyone riding the bus shall wear a facemask for the duration of the trip.

b. Distance

Teams will not be allowed to travel further than 100 miles, oneway, for an away trip. Teams will also not be traveling to counties that are in the "red" status for COVID-19 cases.

c. Incidence Rate

We will be using the Current Incidence Rate found at www.kycovid19.ky.gov to determine if we will travel to or receive teams from certain counties. If a county is in the "red" status two days prior to our scheduled event, we will cancel the event.

d. Procedures for our team arriving at away games

1. Dressing without locker rooms
2. Temperature/symptom checks prior to leaving campus

e. Water/Hydration

1. All athletes/coaches must bring their own water bottles.
2. Water bottles must not be shared.
3. Food should not be shared.
4. Hydration stations (water cows, water trough, water fountains, etc.) must not be utilized.

D. Positive Test Result For Member of Our Team - Athlete and/or Coach

- a. The local health department shall be contacted by the school for further direction and they will likely initiate contact tracing, following regular public health practices.
- b. All schools, public and private, must cooperate with the local public health department if a confirmed case of COVID-19 is identified, and collect the contact information for any close contacts (i.e., individuals less than six feet apart for more than 15 minutes) of the infected individual from two days before he or she showed symptoms to the time when he or she was last at the event.
- c. Close contacts should be quarantined per current CDC protocols.
- d. Local health officials may identify other contacts who require quarantine.
- e. Administrators of the schools involved shall participate in all notification orders if they are notified of the presence of any laboratory positive or clinically diagnosed cases of COVID-19.
- f. The individual with COVID-19 shall not be identified by name to non-family or non-health department officials.
- g. Even if a family/student acknowledges and publicly discloses a positive test, school staff and officials must not participate in discussion or acknowledgment of a positive test by identifying a specific student.
- h. Students, coaches, or officials who were at the event, but not in close contact with a positive case, should continue to be closely monitored for any symptoms of COVID-19.
- i. Areas that were used by the sick person should be closed off and should not be used until after cleaning and disinfecting them (this includes surfaces or shared objects in the area).
- j. If possible, cleaning and disinfecting of the area should not occur until at least 24 hours have elapsed.
- k. If 24 hours is not feasible, as much time as possible should be allowed to pass before cleaning or disinfection occurs.
